Jesus was not speaking in the abstract. His listeners would immediately identify who the son was who said Yes and then did not go: it was most of themselves! - particularly the Pharisees. They were the people of the Covenant who had said Yes to God. The son who said No stood for the Gentiles, and also for outcasts such as tax-collectors and prostitutes. But the point of the parable was to blow away that clear distinction. What counts, he said, is not whether you say Yes or No, but what you do. It was his consistent teaching. Another time he said, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven" (Mt 7:21); and "Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother" (Mt 12:50). The

It is very upsetting to have the lines of demarcation moved. Someone once said that Jesus was the greatest disturber the world has known. He was a disturber of the peace, and still is. Wherever there is a wrong kind of peace he disturbs it. If he is called Prince of Peace it is not because he helps us relax with our complacent map of the world in which the 'right people' are clearly distinguished from the 'wrong people' - but because he brings "a peace the world cannot give."

We need not imagine that Jesus would leave us in peace if he walked our streets again. In the Church we regularly settle for a peace that the world can give: clear distinctions between insiders and outsiders, with a condescending attitude to people of other beliefs; and within the Church a culture of preferment and privilege and honours, which defies the Gospel by saying, in effect, "The first shall be first and the last shall be last." "How very many sheep there are outside the Church," St Augustine wrote, "and how very many wolves within!" But everything comes back to one's own Yes or No. In the light of this reading, Yes and No are not words we say but things we do. A Yes that is said but not done is only an evasion. This Faith was made for walking.

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#### MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

Most of us get annoyed when people say they will do something for us and fail to deliver on their promise. We end up feeling let down. Yet, if we are honest with ourselves, we will recognise that we all fail in this respect, to some extent, at least. We have all said that we will do this or that and then failed to do it. In that sense, there is something of the second son in the parable this weekend in all of us, the son who told his father he would work in the vineyard, but never did so.

Our 'yes' can become a 'no' in practice. There can be many reasons for this. We may say 'yes' just to keep someone happy, without ever really intending to follow up on what we are asked. Or some of us may find it hard to say 'no'. We may tend to say 'yes' to every request and have the intention to follow through, even though we could not possibly do all that we promise to do.

The Gospels proclaim that it is never too late to change for the better. That is a message which all need to hear. Whatever 'no's' we may have said in the past need not determine our present or future responses. Each day is a new day, a new opportunity to say 'yes' to the Lord's call as it comes to us through those among whom we live and work. 'Today' is what matters, not yestérday – in the words of Psalm 95 'O that today you would listen to his voice, harden not your héarts!'. Every 'today' is a new opportunity to put on the 'mind of Christ' that Paul speaks about in the second reading. That 'mind of Christ' shows itself in a willingness to put the interests of others before our own, just as Christ emptied himself for the sake of us all. It is never too late to grow more fully into the mind and heart of Christ.
