I would urge you to look at the 3 new menus on the Home page.

1st is 'Learning From Home' - "Learning Support". In it you will find an animated video and accompanying story book which will help your child to understand '[coronavirus and us](#)', I know that lots will be feeling frightened, this will reassure them a little.

2nd is 'Relax Kids' (J Callan has given permission for us to use her resources)- Coordinated by Mrs Byrne. **We would respectfully suggest that you invest a little time in the programme.** New resources will be uploaded each week. Within the 'Relax Kids' room we also have an '**Audio book**' **section**- fabulous way to entertain your child.

3rd is 'A Message From Home'- we know that the children are missing each other, so feel free to email some photographs in with a little caption. Hopefully this will 'take off' however, feel no pressure- I know that you are doing so much.
